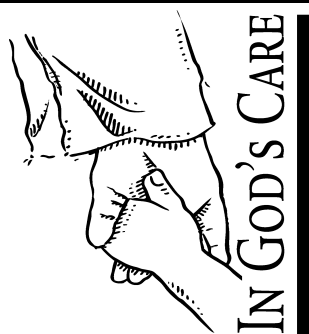

From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Friends,

Our journey in Lent with Christ to the cross is moving to its climax, to what are the most important days of the Christian calendar year. On our first Sunday in April we will come with Jesus into Jerusalem on his Palm Sunday arrival, which was in Jesus' time the day that every Jewish family was to select its chosen lamb for the Passover feast that would be celebrated at sundown on that coming Friday. According to Exodus 12:1-13, God's people were to select a year-old male lamb without blemish. They were to observe it all week and make sure that it completely satisfied God's requirement that it be a flawless lamb for the Passover sacrifice and meal. As we read Mark's gospel, it's powerfully clear that Jesus is God's choice of the perfect Passover Lamb. If you go back and read Mark 11 to 15, you will see that from what we call Palm Sunday and through the following days, Jesus was examined by all the Jewish leaders (Pharisees, Sadducees, Scribes/Teachers of the Law) and by Pilate and Herod. Their encounters with Jesus left them all wondering and in awed silence. Jesus passed every test they had to throw at him and each time he proved that he was a Lamb without any flaw.

In Luke 23 and John 18-19 we read as Pilate even declares three times during Christ's trial before him: *I find no fault in him!* Jesus is the perfect Lamb of God who alone is fit to be the one and last perfect sacrifice for human sin. As we find in Isaiah 53:6

"We all, like sheep, have gone astray, each of us has turned to his own way; and the LORD has laid on him the iniquity of us all."

Come, Let Us Worship the Lamb of God!

I want to call each of us to come and worship God's chosen Lamb, Jesus Christ, in this holy season. Come to sing hosannas! in one 10:00 a.m. service on Palm Sunday, April 5, and watch as Jesus knowingly comes to the city where he would be sacrificed for us! Let us leave worship that day together, moving yet with Christ and his mission into the week of his testing (and ours!). Let us gather again on Thursday of Holy Week for the celebration of the supper he instituted with his disciples just hours before his passion began. Come prepared for a special night of holy reflection, scripture, music and sharing in a meal as we come to communion together at the close of the night (see page for more details of this important night). From the end of our meal on Thursday to Sunday morning we will each have the hours on our own to think of Jesus' willingness to suffer and die for us on the cross of Good Friday. But then, be prepared on the holiest, most joyful day of the whole year to return for exuberant praise and worship as we lift our voices together and declare: ***JESUS IS ALIVE! DEATH CANNOT HOLD HIM DOWN!***

Please, don't miss a moment of opportunity to walk with Jesus in this awesome season of sorrow that turns to great joy when death is undone. May God bless you with a growing sense of his profound love and purpose in sending Jesus to be our perfect Passover Lamb.

CALLING ALL COOKS

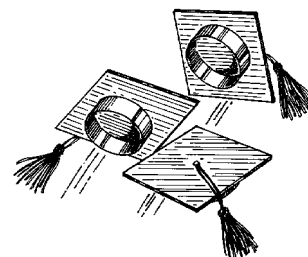

Jaimie Curtis, a high school senior in E.D.G.E., shares her story of how she was prepared to give an answer when she was recently asked about her faith at school. After reading her story below, please keep Jaimie and her friend in your prayers as Jaimie continues to share her faith with her.

There is a spiritual high you get when your prayers are answered. In E.D.G.E., we have been learning about how to tell our testimonies; before Christ, meeting Christ, and after Christ. We have been praying to God to give us a chance to tell our stories. Recently, I got that chance. There is a girl in one of my classes who has

been asking questions about Christ, but nothing too deep. I have been trying to get her more interested without being too overbearing. I have been praying for her for a long time and praying that I find the right words to give her. Just this past week, she asked me the question I have been dying to hear: "Hey...ummm...how..did you know..it was the right time...you know, ... to accept Christ?"

As the words left her mouth, my heart started racing and I couldn't stop the smile from spreading across my face.



"Um... well I had a curiosity, just like you do now, and I didn't really think much of it. Because I'm Catholic, we all have to accept Christ in 2nd grade, even though most of us do not understand what's going on. So, I thought I had already accepted Christ. Then, I went to Sno Camp with First Presbyterian

Church. The first night, during worship, I looked around and kids had their eyes closed and their hands in the air. At the sight of this, something in my heart didn't feel right. These kids had something I did not, that was very apparent. The next night, during our free time, Randy asked me if I wanted to go for a walk and we did. That night, as I prayed and accepted Christ, there was an actual feeling of weight being lifted off of me. Now, I'm still curious for Christ, I read my Bible and try to live by Him. I have grown so much spiritually."

At first, she didn't say anything. She looked deep in thought. I feared I had said too much. Then, she looked at me with a huge smile on her face and said, "Thanks." I invited her to Breakaway; hopefully here she will ask more questions. I pray I find the right words to give her.

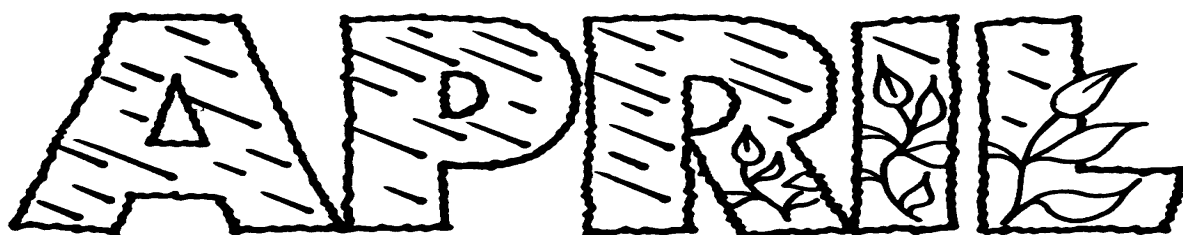
