



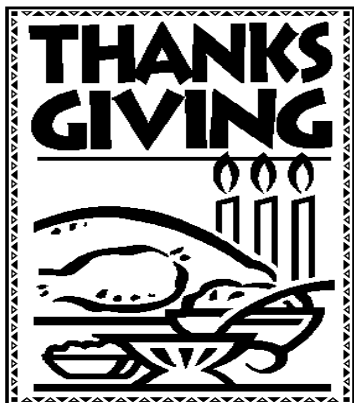

### What is the Christmas Joy Offering?

A Presbyterian tradition for almost seventy years, the Christmas Joy Offering is one of the four special offerings designated by the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) to provide congregations direct ways of supporting specific causes that help those in need. The receipts from the Offering are distributed equally to the Board of Pensions for assistance programs and to Racial Ethnic and Women's Ministries of the General Assembly Council to support Presbyterian racial ethnic education.

So exactly where is the Offering used?

**The Board of Pensions:** The Christmas Joy Offering recognizes the faithfulness of current and retired church workers by providing funds to help them through difficult times. To help retired church workers and their surviving spouses, the board offers Income Supplements to raise incomes to a level where retirees can continue to maintain their independence.

**Presbyterian racial ethnic schools and colleges:** Christmas Joy Offering funds provide scholarships to deserving students as well as help with basic operating costs. This funding enables the students to discover and pursue their Professional goals.

During the month of December inserts will be placed in the bulletins every week. These inserts will explain more about what the Christmas Joy Offering is supporting.

Christmas Joy Offering envelopes will be put in the pew racks for your use during the month of December.

May the gifts we share bring joy to others as our witness to the love made human in your Son, Jesus Christ, in whose name we pray. Amen.

## “A Frequent Flyer” By: Anna E. Burns

My early childhood days were spent with my parents on a farm near Greenvew, Illinois; a small town located 30 miles north of Springfield. I recall a very happy and exciting experience in my life that occurred during that time and I would like to share it with you.

The airmail service was begun in 1926 from Chicago to St. Louis and Charles A. Lindbergh piloted the first southbound plane and continued to fly the route for a year – passing directly over our home each evening about 4:00 p.m.

I would listen for the roar of the plane engine in the distance, grasp a big white tea towel, (a bleached muslin flour sack), race out-of-doors to a corner of the yard to await the approaching “big bird in the sky”, piloted by this little girl’s airborne idol. Oh! What a thrill to see him sitting in the open cockpit for those few fleeting moments as he passed over our farm. I would wave my big towel frantically, hoping he would remember to look down – and he didn’t disappoint me – he’d dip a wing and raise his hand to wave to me as he continued his flight over the countryside and I’d return to the house bubbling with excitement.

The newspapers published articles announcing our airmail pilot was going to attempt a non-stop flight across the Atlantic from New York to Europe. Few people thought Lindbergh had a chance. Some newspaper editors labeled him a “flying fool”. Clifford Harmon, President of the International League of Aviators said, “I do not think that a man can stay awake 36 hours by himself with nothing but the sea, sky and air as an environment and a motor roaring away monotonously.”

I read every news article I could find. I listened to every radio broadcast on our Atwater Kent radio (that had two earphones), hoping to learn more about Lindy and all the time fearing for his safety.

On May 20, 1927, this lanky, 6 foot 4 inch, 25 year old pilot climbed into a one-engine plane, “The Spirit of St. Louis”, ready to take off after something no man in history had ever achieved. Reporters announced the plane looked “completely incapable of flight” as it was towed onto the runway shrouded and dripping in the rain. The fuel tanks were filled with 450 gallons of gasoline, exceeding the design limitation by 25 gallons. Other problems were a tail wind; a muddy runway and the 5,300 pounds would be more than had ever achieved lift-off from a 223 horsepower engine. But, within minutes, the news was flashed around the world that Lindy had successfully taken off from Roosevelt Field, Long Island at 7:52 p.m., May 20, 1927.

Because the sudden break in the Atlantic’s weather pattern had been unanticipated, Lindbergh’s flight had been delayed and he had not slept for 23 hours prior to take-off. Ahead, lay blinding fog that threatened to drown the engine. Ice storms and 15 hours of limited navigation due to darkness and a gasoline tank in front of the cockpit, prevented him from seeing straight ahead.

Thirty-three and one-third hours later, at 10:22 p.m., May 21, Charles A. Lindbergh and his plane, “The Spirit of St. Louis”, landed at Paris, France. He had just become the first person in the world to fly non-stop across the Atlantic from New York to Europe. He had flown 3,600 miles at an average speed of 107.5 m.p.h. One hundred-thousand people were there to greet him. “The Spirit of St. Louis” is a wonderful plane”, Lindbergh said. “It’s like a living creature, gliding along smoothly, happily, as though a successful flight means as much to it as to me, as though we shared our experiences together, each feeling beauty, life and death as keenly, each dependent on the other’s loyalty. We have made this flight across the ocean, not I or it.” At 4:15 a.m., May 22, Lindbergh went to sleep for the first time in 63 hours.

My mother passed away July 17, 1927 and I went to live with my grandparents. I was sad and lonely and to cheer me my grandmother promised she would take me to see Lindy the very first time he was in our vicinity. I remember well his triumphant return to Springfield on August 15, 1927. When he swooped down in his famous “spirit of St. Louis”, 60,000 people turned out to greet him and to watch the parade. My dear grandmother, who had done so many nice things for me, had arranged for reserved seats in the armory so I could hear him speak. I had seen my aviator hero in person, I had heard him speak and although I was so filled with awe I could not remember a word he said, I was floating on “cloud nine”.

Lindbergh still remains a hero today to aviators the world over. He died in 1974 at the age of 72. To this day, his flight remains the greatest exploit in the history of aviation. Never has an individual won such worldwide acclaim.
