Looking Back 150 years 1997

FPC in 1997 – just over 20 years ago! Jamie Miller was our pastor, and Kirk Hawthorne was our Director of Youth and Family ministries. We had about 300 members, and 16 in the confirmation class. Casey Mestelle Clemens was one of those in the class. Our church family also celebrated with Jack and Sandy Finnegan as they married that year!

FPC elders included current elders Dan Mestelle and Mike Farrell as well as Arla Severson and Dr. Don Morehead. The session was busy with several projects aimed at building improvements and educating and spiritually building church members.

During the year the Evangelism committee held a couple of workshops, the first was attended by 56 and was on the topic of Discerning Spiritual Gifts, the next was on Parenting Adolescents, and the last was on Estate Planning, with 50 people involved.

The Trustees were working hard on air conditioning the sanctuary, managing all of the details related to having that in place by summer. It was installed for a cost about \$25,000, and the worship services and other events were comfortable! Additionally, Clarence Best passed away and left 25% of his estate to FPC for either a "steeple, or new chapel". The trustees began to explore the best use of this endowment. (The steeple was raised a couple of years later)

The high school youth group had grown under Kirk's leadership. The church had sent a small group of youth to Philippi West Virginia with Group Work camps to restore homes in that high poverty area several years before this was a positive experience and the interest with the youth in our church and in the community was growing. The group held a fundraiser in the spring for the trip and later in the year we were able to purchase a van for about \$4000.

In August, Pastor Jamie announced his plan to leave this congregation and move to South Bend Indiana in October. The session identified that a local pastor was retiring and earlier in the year he reached out to FPC to develop an informal agreement to work with our congregation. We looked forward to meeting Bill Tammen! The session worked to focus on church membership and attendance to assure that members would not fall away when we were without a full time pastor. The plan they developed included reaching out to member who were not in worship each month and reconnecting with them personally. In November, elders reached out to 8 people and in December they reached out to 3 members.

According to the book of order, a Pastor Nominating Committee was formed and began their work, and at the same time an interim search committee was formed to have in place a full time temporary pastor.

In December, Dr. Thomas Young was hired as the interim pastor to begin in January 1998.
