This mission to Uganda began in 2008 with two women (Debbie Damron and Dianne Jamison) who didn't have a clue that it would still be going strong 11 years later! It was not in their plan, but they both felt it was GOD'S PLAN for their lives! Neither felt qualified, but all seemed to work out as each woman kept saying YES to God's promises. Looking back on the work that's been accomplished, it is evident to see the impact the various projects have made on the lives of individuals and families. It's been said that the presence of the Believe In Uganda (BIUG) team in Namyoya, Kahondo, Ft. Portal, and Kamwenge has been been lifechanging, as the people feel love and hope because of this involvement and the various projects in their communities. As much as they appreciate the gifts given because of the generosity of many, the families often say that they would love and appreciate the team even if they arrived empty handed; a real testament to how GOD has made His presence known through this work! It truly is life-changing God-infused opportunity!

Currently, Team BIUG stands at seven members who will be going to Uganda June 24-July 9! This is the biggest team yet and the excitement is rising as the team anticipates what God has in store! Of the seven, three have journeyed to Uganda before; Debbie Damron, Nathalie Schmidt and Marta Johnson; four will be experiencing this unique opportunity for the first time, Joe Schmidt, Steve Johnson, Cathy Peters and Mark Gaspar! A lofty agenda is being generated with the help of Milton Tusingwire, ITI director.

Some of the projects include the following activities:

- 1. Setting up two libraries in at Galilaya and Ngombe Primary Schools.
- 2. Distributing reusable menstrual pads to girls and Mama Kits to expectant mothers.
- 3. Starting construction of a permanent home for a family who is in dire need!
- 4. Presenting Character Development discussions at one or two high schools. We hope to add Spirituality as one of the pillars to discuss.
- 5. Blessing families with food, clothing and gifts as the team gets to know each family better. Praying with family follows the gathering.
- 6. "God's Masterpiece Quilt" will be presented to the community of Kahondo. There will be much celebrating as the fundraising total will be announced to the community which will provide an ambulance for the medical center.
- 7. Attending church in Namyoya and Kahondo.

- 8. The team will meet with Village Savings and Loan Association (VSLA) families to witness their progress from the Revolving Seed distribution last year.
- 9. Safari at Murchison Falls in Northern Uganda.
