WE HAVE CONNECTIONS

We at First Presbyterian Church of Ottawa are connected to Blackhawk Presbytery (office at Stronghold near Oregon, Illinois, on the Rock River). We are connected to Synod of Lincoln Trails (office in Indianapolis, Indiana). We are connected to the Presbyterian Church, U.S.A. (General Assembly (GA) office in Louisville, Kentucky). We are know as the connectional denomination. We are independent, yet connected. Each year, we receive a notification from Blackhawk Presbytery of our commitment to send *per capita* (literally, per head) monies for each active member of our congregation to Presbytery for use in the ministry and administration of the three levels of church ministry, namely Presbytery (Blackhawk), Synod (Lincoln Trails), and General Assembly (PCUSA). The *per capita* commitment for our congregation for 2019 is \$38.47 per member for 144 members (GA gets \$8395, Synod gets \$3.81 and Blackhawk Presbytery gets \$25.71), which comes to \$5,539.68 due by the end of 2019. Please see a Session member for answer to any questions. Please pray how you can pay, and play your part in our connectional family. Thank you.


Ottawa Community Food Basket:
