TOWN HALL MEETING

PER CAPITA GIVING RECONSIDERED

PER CAPITA AMOUNT= The amount per member as determined by Blackhawk Presbytery times the number of active members in the congregation, said amount being given to support the ministries of Blackhawk Presbytery, Synod of Lincoln Trails, and General Assembly of PCUSA.

For many years, First Presbyterian Church of Ottawa (FPCO) paid the total per capita amount in full through Presbytery, regardless of how many members actually contributed their individual per member amount. Several years ago, Session voted to pay through Presbytery only the amount of per capita actually contributed by the FPCO members. Because not all members paid their share, this left a greater shortfall in the amount paid to Presbytery.

Session is now considering returning to the original method of paying the total per capita amount requested, and not just the amount collected from the FPCO members for that purpose. In this way, even though there may be a shortfall in the per capita giving by the members, FPCO will fulfill its obligations to the larger Church of Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly.

Session is requesting input from the FPCO members and will hold a TOWN HALL MEETING on Sunday September 15 immediately following worship service in the sanctuary. Please join us to offer your suggestions and recommendations. Session will vote on the per capita question on Tuesday September 17 at 7:00 o' clock p.m., so please offer your ideas to Session before then, or come to the Session meeting with your input. Thank you for your prayers in this regard. God Bless.

In Pursuit of Peter

How did Peter transform from an uneducated fisherman into one of the most celebrated and beloved Jesus-followers in history? New Testament scholar Con Campbell wanted to find out. It's one thing to read about people in Scripture. It's another thing to trace their life histories to more fully understand their backgrounds and the profound effect Jesus had on them. Con invites you to join him in his pursuit of Peter.

Explore the places where Peter lived and traveled, starting by the Sea of Galilee where he labored as a fisherman--an unlikely disciple, but purposely called by Christ. Continue the journey to Jerusalem, Turkey, Rome, and other locations where Con meets people who provide insights into Peter's passionate personality. You'll see the life of Peter unfold through Scripture, interviews, and stunning onlocation footage.

In Pursuit of Peter is an extraordinary introduction to the Apostle Peter. The captivating film series features Professor Con Campbell, a gifted and masterful teacher. Viewers will be blessed by investing time with this excellent six-part series (22 minutes in length each week), which is enjoyable, informative, insightful, edifying, and transformative.

- The Man and the Sea (21 minutes) A fisherman from the Sea of Galilee has his world disrupted when he meets Jesus. Immediately Jesus changes his name from Simon to Peter, meaning "Rock." But Peter doesn't understand why. The answer would be revealed over the next few years.
- Who is this Man? (21 minutes) As a follower of Jesus, Peter had a front row seat to His teaching and miracles. Seeing them through Peter's eyes shows how they altered his paradigm of who Jesus is and the kingdom Jesus came to build.
- **Hope of Messiah** (21 minutes) With Jesus as Messiah, Peter anticipates the conquest of the Roman occupiers and a Jewish kingdom. But when Jesus surrenders to the authorities in Jerusalem, Peter panics. He denies knowing Jesus and is flooded with grief, but soon his hope is renewed when Jesus restores him.
- **Hope of the Nations** (22 minutes) After Jesus departs for heaven, Peter's rocklike boldness emerges when the Spirit comes and indwells all who believe in Jesus. Three thousand people from around the Roman world respond in faith, and Peter becomes the foundational leader of the Jesus movement.

- **New Horizons** (23 minutes) After Peter leads the church in Jerusalem for a decade, his role changes. As an eyewitness to Jesus's life and with the heart of a pastor, he moves across the Mediterranean world reminding troubled followers that this world is not their home.
- **Veneration** (22 minutes) Peter's final destination is Rome, the center of world influence. From there he writes his final words-words to live by and words to die by. Although he's crucified by Emperor Nero, his contribution to establishing the faith is incalculable.
