Remembering Helen Franz 1923-2019: Read Her Faith Story

Hello!! My name is Helen Franz. I'm a lifelong resident of Ottawa, and member of First Presbyterian Church. This is my second year as a member of Presbyterian Evangelism Committee. I accepted Jesus as my Savior when I was quite young, but it wasn't until after the death of my hu7sbad in 1972 that I knew Him as Lord of my life, as well as my Savior.

I can't remember not being a part of the Church. As children we <u>had</u> to attend Sunday School, Church, Youth Groups, and any other related activity. My Dad was, at different times, an Elder, S.S. teacher, choir director, soloist, youth leader, so staying away from Church was not high on our priority list. Actually, it wasn't even an option. I'm grateful for that now, though I didn't appreciate the discipline that was being instilled until years later.

Though I had accepted Christ as my Savior, I wasn't really sure how that applied to my life, or what I was to do with Him. I know He loved me: the Bible told me so. I knew He died for me: the Bible told me that, too. But then—what? Little by little, as I learned more about Him and His never-ending love, the pieces began to fall in place. Then, after Dick's death, when I was at the lowest point in my life, I cried out to Him asking: "Who am I? Once I was a wife, a mother (by then my youngest was a high school Jr.), but now I'm nothing. Lord, please show me who I am." I will never forget the special moment that followed as He answered I "felt" a gentle whisper say: "You are my child. I love you, and I will not leave you or forsake you." A sense of His loving, caring and warmth flooded me, and for the first time in my life I really KNEW Jesus, for a Peace filled me such as I had never experienced before. At that moment Jesus became my Lord, my friend, counselor, healer, comforter—everything, to me.

I would like to say that from then on my life was free of any problem, stress, grief, or anything that would cause an unhappy time in my life, BUT you all know from living in the "real" world that does not happen. Being human we constantly battle our old sinful nature which manifests itself in different ways in our lives. I still make lots of mistakes and as Paul said: I do the very thing I do not want to do, and the thing I want to do, I don't do.

BUT this I CAN say with certainty: Since that wonderful moment alone with my Lord He has been faithful. Faithful to never leave me or forsake me (though many times I've tried to go on my own and "do it myself"). He is faithful to forgive me when I do. He is my Sure Foundation. The Rock on which I can stand, and I KNOW that with Jesus in charge of my life, all work according to His plan as long as I continue to rest in Him, to seek and do His will. **Pastor** John W. 
