Sunday School Classes for All!

GROW all followers to deeper faith - Sunday School classes for all ages at FPC this fall:

The Bible ZONE is FPC's Sunday School ministry for kids Pre-K to eighth grade. The word ZONE stands for "Zeal for God, Oneness in Relationships, Nurture in God's Word, and Exercising our Faith, all of which are our goals. We have two groups, the younger ages (Pre-K to fifth grade), and sixth to eighth grade.

The younger group meets Sunday mornings from 8:15-9 am in the East Room (big playroom downstairs). We will be going through the New Testament using a giant felt board with very elaborate and colorful felt pieces to build each Bible lesson. We also spend some time memorizing scripture and catechism. There's usually time for a snack, plenty of paper and crayons/colored pencils for those who love to draw, and time to play. The curriculum is published by Veritas Press and "Through the Bible in Felt" by Betty Lukens.

The older kids up through 8th grade meet after church, from 10:45 – 11:30 am in an upstairs Sunday School room. We will continue to go through scripture in chronologic order. Our conversations are insightful, and it's such a joy to watch our young people grow up and learn about God's Word. The curriculum is by Veritas Press and includes reading scripture and talking about the concepts/events that took place. It's always so much fun to hear everyone's perspective at such a formative age. If you have any questions, ask or call Susanne Gibbs at 304 -633-7172

Senior High kids meet at 10:45am in the classroom on the east end of the main floor.

War Won't Stop Christmas in Ukraine

From Samaritan Purse's September newsletter: Through our Operation Christmas Child project, Samaritan's Purse has been working in Ukraine since 1996 and has delivered 11.6 million shoebox gifts. We thank God that these children have had an opportunity to hear and respond to the Gospel of Jesus Christ.

You might think it would be impossible to continue this ministry in a war zone, but our dedicated church partners have been unstoppable—reaching another 400,000 children through shoebox outreach events since the fighting began. This year, it's more important than ever to reach children who have been traumatized by all the bloodshed, blasts, and sirens. They need to know that God loves them and has not forgotten them.

Not only are churches working faithfully to hand out shoebox gifts, but they are also holding The Greatest Journey classes. This is the 12-lesson discipleship program that we offer to children who receive shoebox gifts. We thank God that the year before the fighting began, more than 125,000 children graduated from The Greatest Journey, receiving a Bible in their own language from Samaritan's Purse. Most importantly, we praise God for each one who prayed to receive Jesus Christ as their Lord and Savior.

National Christmas Shoebox Collection Week will be Nov. 14-21.

In addition to Ukraine, we are planning to send Operation Christmas Child shoe-box gifts to more than 100 countries around the world. Each and every gift is a powerful demonstration of God's love.

Please join us in praying for peace in Ukraine. May these children and their families find hope in the words the angels spoke over Bethlehem the night Jesus was born: "Glory to God in the highest, and on earth peace, goodwill toward men" (Luke 2:14).



The Adult Bible Study Will Begin A New Study Of The Gospel of Luke that starts Sunday October 30th, 2022.

We plan to meet in the library at 11:00 am after worship each Sunday.

Can we know what Jesus was truly like during His time on Earth? A first century physician set out to gather eyewitness testimony on the life, teaching, and ministry of Jesus Christ. The result is a close-up account of a compassionate Savior on His journey to redeem His people. The gospel is for believers and skeptics alike, written so "that you may have certainty" (Luke 1:4) about the Son of Man who came to seek and save the lost.

Luke, the beloved physician, saw so clearly the humanness of Jesus that it is no wonder his gospel presents the Lord as Son of Man. With sensitivity he details the birth of the Savior and the relationship of Christ to the people He ministered to.

I hope that you can join us for this exciting study about the life, death and resurrection of Jesus and how our lives are forever changed.

CHRIST THE KING SUNDAY NOVEMBER 20

The festival of Christ the King (or Reign of Christ) ends our marking of Ordinary Time after the Day of Pentecost, and moves us to the threshold of Advent, the season of hope for Christ's coming again at the end of time.

The day centers on the crucified and risen Christ, whom God exalted to rule over the whole universe. The celebration of the lordship of Christ thus looks back to Ascension, Easter, and Transfiguration, and points ahead to the appearing in glory of the King of kings and Lord of lords. Christ reigns supreme. Christ's truth judges falsehood. As the Alpha and Omega, the beginning and the end, Christ is the center of the universe, the ruler of all history, the judge of all people. In Christ all things began, and in Christ all things will be fulfilled. In the end, Christ will triumph over the forces of evil.

Such concepts as these cluster around the affirmation that Christ is King or Christ reigns! As sovereign ruler, Christ calls us to a loyalty that transcends every earthly claim on the human heart. To Christ alone belongs the supreme allegiance in our lives. Christ calls us to stand with those who in every age confessed, "Jesus Christ is Lord!" In every generation, demagogues emerge to claim an allegiance that belongs only to God. But Christ alone has the right to claim our highest loyalty. The blood of martyrs, past and present, witnesses to this truth.


Youth Christian Education
